Counseling and Psychotherapy

Individual, couple, and family counseling with children, adolescents, and adults in outpatient and inpatient settings; counseling of university students with personal, vocational, and marital concerns; diagnostic interviews; crisis intervention; counseling of adolescent boys in residential treatment program; vocational rehabilitation counseling of physically, mentally and emotionally handicapped persons; veterans educational assessment and advising.

Program Development

Group Facilitation
